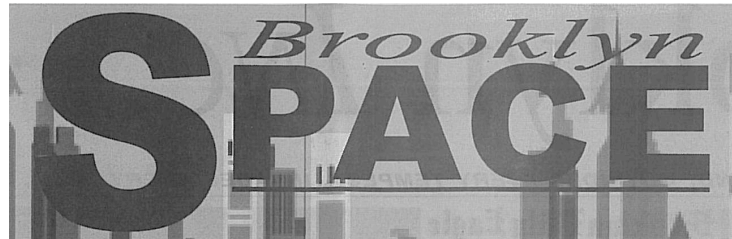

Brooklyn Developer To Be Honored By Catalog for Giving

Brooklyn native Kenneth S. Horn, Esq., best known locally as the developer of the Lookout Hill condominiums at 199 State St. in Downtown Brooklyn, will be honored by The Catalog for Giving of New York City at its 13th Annual Urban Heroes Award Benefit event Tuesday, Oct. 21, at Pier Sixty, Chelsea Piers in Manhattan.

Horn was also recently appointed to the organization's board of directors.

Raised in the Crown Heights and Flatbush neighborhoods of Brooklyn, and a graduate of Madison High School, he is currently president of Alchemy Properties, a company he

founded.

Horn describes The Catalog as a "financially responsible organization that positively impacts the lives of at-risk youth, provides opportunities to those most in need, and is led by individuals who are devoted to the cause." He said even as a teenager in Brooklyn, he recognized that young adults need structure and attention in order to thrive and reach their potential.

Susan Wyant, executive director of The Catalog, said that "Kenneth Horn's commitment to The Catalog's mission, passion for helping children and influence in the community make him an invaluable asset to our board. We are delighted that he has decided to further his commitment to our mission in this way."

Horn joins the board at a time of transition, according to Wyant. The Catalog will announce its 10 new member organizations in the late fall.

As far as further development projects, Horn has told the *Eagle* he is looking for another project to do in Brooklyn.

The Oct. 21 event begins with a silent auction at 6 p.m., followed by dinner, a live auction and the awards presentations beginning at 7 p.m.

The event will feature Bill Ritter of WABC as emcee and, as presenters, Jo Jo Starbuck, world figure skating champion; Simon Doonan, Barney's creative director and VH1 personality; and Congressman Gregory Meeks.
